Dr. Cousins has written twenty volumes of poetry dealing with Ireland. He became associated with W. B. Yeats and George Russell, who appeared at another university convocation last month. Professor in India. Moving to India in 1915 he became professor of English and later principal of a college of Hindu boys at the University of Madras. He spent twelve years on the faculty of Indian universities with the exception of a year as special professor of English and poetry in the Keiojuku university in Tokyo, Japan. He was the first foreigner on whom the university and the Japanese imperial ministry of education conferred the degree of doctor of literature.
