Wants Legal Change

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Nebraska Historical Society Has Copy of State's First Newspaper

In the library of the Nebraska State Historical society, the only place in the state where Nebraska papers are systematically kept, is to be found the first newspaper of Nebraska which was published at Bellevue, July 15, 1845.

These papers, both professing to deal with arts, sciences, agriculture, politics, and general literature, were written in very flowery phrases and were taken across the Missouri to Iowa to be printed.

The library receives practically every paper now being published in the state, including daily, weekly, and monthly copies, which they have bound when sufficient copy is collected.
