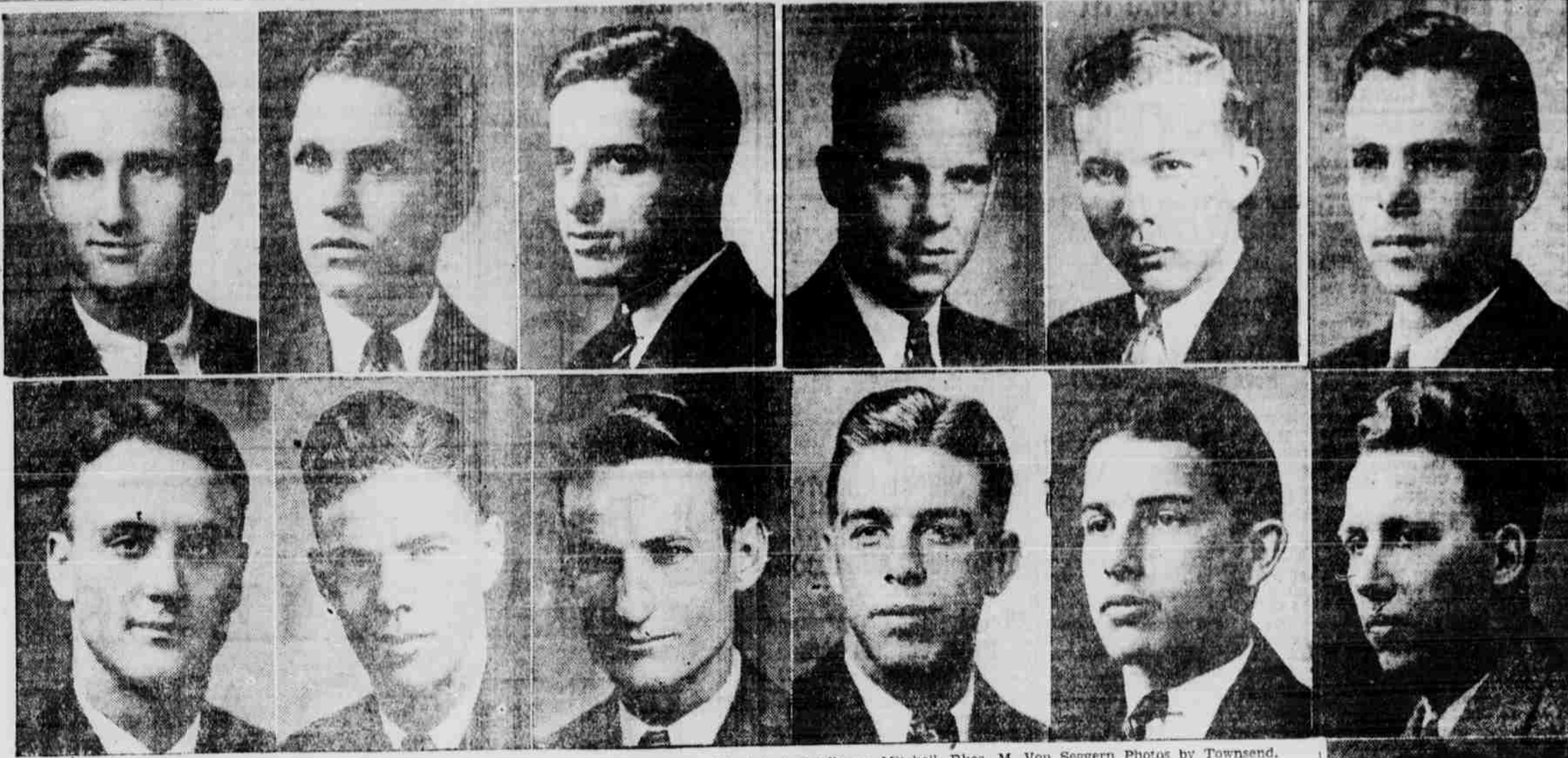


These Men "Tapped" As New Members Of Innocents Society
