

HUSKERS AT TOP OF LADDER AS SEASON CLOSES

Scarlet Proves Superiority Over Conference Foes in Tight Finish.

CYCLONES ARE SECOND

Missouri Plays Charity Tilt With Temple Saturday At Kansas City.

University of Nebraska stands at the top of the conference as the Big Six race closes. A 23 to 0 victory over Iowa State by the Huskers furnished the dramatic finish to one of the most tightly contested races in the history of the conference.

Kansas won its traditional clash with the Missouri Tigers 14 to 0, and Kansas State turned back North Dakota 19 to 6 in a hard fought game.

Huskers Superior.

The Cornhusker's decisive win over Iowa State proved without a doubt the superiority of the victors. Rolling up a tremendous number of yards from scrimmage, the Huskers held the Cyclone attack powerless. Louie Brown, diminutive quarterback for Nebraska, turned in the high point of the game when he ran 80 yards from the line of scrimmage for a touchdown to repeat his performance at Kansas State the preceding week when he ran 70 yards for a counter.

Kansas Jayhawks, with a powerful team that has been unable to get started this year, turned in their best performance and upset the dope bucket to win from Missouri 14 to 0. Missouri was never dangerous and Kansas had things pretty much their own way.

Kaggies Win.

A highly rated North Dakota eleven found Kansas Aggies a little too much for them, and went back home on the long end of a 19 to 6 score. North Dakota scored first shortly before the first half ended, but the Aggies went on a passing spree and before the end of the period scored on a pass, McMillin to Auker. The two remaining touchdowns came on passes, Breen to Harsh and Breen to Cronkite.

As the season came to a close with Nebraska leading, it found Iowa State in firm possession of second place, Kansas State third, Kansas fourth and Oklahoma and Missouri tied for last place with one win each. Kansas and Iowa State did not meet each other.

Pitt Game Features.

The Pittsburgh-Nebraska clash at Pittsburgh Thanksgiving stands out as the outstanding game of the week. The Huskers are entering the game on the bottom of the dope bucket, but previous games between the two teams show that advance predictions mean little or nothing. The game will attract nationwide attention as the winners of the Big Six meet what is slated to be one of the outstanding teams in the east. The game should be close, with the Panthers emerging on the long end of a close score.

On the same day Kansas State will meet Washburn at Topeka in a game which should be all Kansas. Oklahoma meets Oklahoma A. & M. in their traditional battle and the Sooners are rated as likely winners.

The first Big Six charity game of the year will be held Saturday at Muehleback field in Kansas City between the University of Missouri and Temple university of Philadelphia. Temple has a strong team and should take the Tigers who emerged in bad shape from the Kansas game last week.

OKLAHOMA MENTOR PICKS BIG SIX TEAM

Lindsey Says Rhea, Sauer, Cronkite and Young Outstanding.

NORMAN, Ok.—Kansas State shaded all other Big Six schools in an all-star squad of 22 Big Six football players submitted by Adrain Lindsey, the Sooner coach to newspapers and press associations soliciting same thruout the mid-west sector.

Declining to name a first and second all-star Big Six team because of the well-known prejudice toward all-star teams as such, the Sooner mentor instead named what were in his opinion the two outstanding men for every position, grouping his guards, tackles, ends and halfbacks into separate groups of four.

Rhea, Sauer Among Best. "I regard Rhea, Cronkite, Young and Sauer as the outstanding men in the conference this season," declared the Sooner coach. "Auker of Kansas State is in my opinion the best safety in the conference. He is so tall it is almost impossible to pass over him, and he can tackle and run the ball back." Altho Nebraska did not fare quite as well as Kansas State in the squad ballot, it will be noticed that half of the four outstanding players named by Lindsey are Cornhuskers.
