Schools Debate Phases of

"Is the Present Economic System Deficient?" was the theme carried out during the entire conference. Rev. Ray Hunt gave the opening address Saturday at 9 o'clock. The first debate was given by Midland college and York college on the topic "Is our present economic system responsible for the recurring periods of business depression?" Alfred Adams conducted the open forum held immediately after the debate.
