

MISSOURI QUINTET DEFEATS NEBRASKA BASKETEERS 39-31

Huskiers Drop to Cellar
Position in the Big
Six Race.

In one of the fastest exhibitions of basketball which has been put on in the coliseum, the Missouri Tigers defeated the Nebraska five by a 39 to 31 score Saturday night. This defeat relegated the Huskers to exclusive possession of the cellar position in the Big Six standings, and was the first victory for the Tigers on an opponents floor during the current cage season.

George Wagner, lanky Missouri center, was the Tiger ace and handy-man, and during the evening contributed 15 points to the Edwards cause, with his special short side shot serving as the tool.

Nebraska started out fast and soon had five points to nothing for the visitors, but immediately in the wake of the Nebraska flurry came 10 counters for Missouri which made the count 10 to 5. From here on the invaders held the upper hand, and a Husker rally failed to regain the lead for the Brownemen as the victors held the advantage at the rest period, 23 to 17.

The second period was decidedly rough, and as a result George Sauer went out on fouls and two Tigers, George Stuber and Jorgenson, incurred four personals and were put out of the game. Parsons, Henrion and Mason succeeded at one time in scoring enough points to set the score at 30 to 26, Missouri, but Wagner and Cooper went on another splurge and cinched the game.

Wagner led the Tiger scoring with his 15 points and Johnny Cooper was right in the thick of

things with 10. Cooper exhibited the fine floor game for which he has gained some good deal of fame in these parts. Hatfield played a fine defensive game for the victors.

Paul Mason was at the head of the column among the Husker scorers, the Omaha contributing 9 points, and Walt Henrion was close behind with 8. George Sauer played a fine game at guard, even tho his man, Wagner, was the high point man among the Missourians. Wagner's height proved a distinct advantage for him, and Sauer spoiled many of the Missourian's efforts, when it appeared that he would certainly score.
