REGIMENT TO STAGE PARADE ON APRIL 27

Highest Ranking Company Will Receive One Per Cent in Compet.

A retreat parade will be staged by the cadet regiment on Thursday, April 27, according to a general order issued by the military department recently. This is one of a series of parades and inspections staged by the military department in preparation for the general inspection which will be held in May.

The company receiving the highest rating will receive 1 percent at compet. The company standing second will receive one-half percent and the company winning third place will receive one-fourth percent at compet. Companies will be judged on percentage basis, attendance counting 20 percent, marching of company into position, 20 percent, conduct and bearing of officers, 20 percent (this includes handling of saber), action of pivot men and guides, 20 percent, and marching in review—stops and alignment—20 percent.

First call will be sounded at 4:50 p. m., assembly at 5, battalion adjutant's call at 5:05 and regimental adjutant's call on signal.

The cadet regiment will form as follows: Band on 12th street facing north with the rear of the band resting near the north end of the stadium; Prov. battalion—Pershing Rifles—on the road north of Memorial hall facing north. Headquarters company on 12th street in rear of the band; First battalion, on the road in front of the coliseum, battalion in line facing south. The right of the battalion to rest on 12th street; Second battalion, on walk in front of Nebraska hall, battalion in line facing west. The right of the battalion to rest on the road north of Nebraska hall. As soon as formed to move on 12th street and halt in rear of band; Third battalion, on walk in front of stadium, battalion in line facing west. The right of the battalion to rest on walk near north end of stadium.

At the regimental adjutant's call the regiment will form on the parade ground in line of battalions in line of close columns facing north.

Dr. L. E. Tavis, director of the speech clinic at the University of

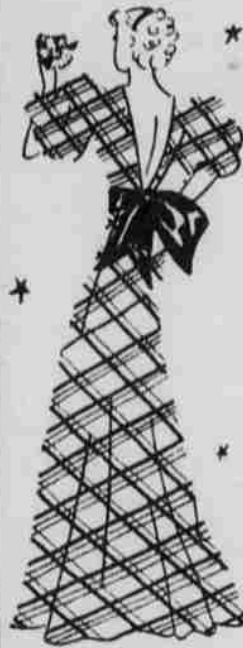
