The university Friday will be the scene of the meetings of the Utilities section of the League of Nebraska Municipalities in Room 110, Nebraska hall. The meeting will be called to order by Chairman J. Rex Henry of Fremont at 10:30 a. m. Dr. A. L. Lugin of the geology department faculty will speak on "The Ground Water Resources of Nebraska" at 10:45. Discussion will follow this talk.

Following lunch the meeting will again be called to order at 1:15 and Dr. G. E. Condra, dean and director of the Conservation and Survey division, assisted by L. O. Vose, bacteriologist of the State Health department, will speak on "Conservation of Pure Drinking Water." Lantern slides will be used to illustrate the talk.

Prof. C. J. Frankforter, of the department of chemistry, will speak on "The Chemistry and Chemical Treatment of Nebraska Waters" at 3 o'clock.

Dinner will be held at the Cornhusker hotel at 6 o'clock followed by the evening meeting which will commence at 7. Business of the section will be taken up followed by a paper on "Effective Water Systems" given by I. N. Downs, Dempster Mill Manufacturing company of Beatrice.

This meeting is being sponsored by the Water Survey Department of the Conservation and Survey division and commissioners of water and light departments in the various cities of the state will be in attendance at this quarterly meeting.
