The conference would assume the nature of a model League of Nations assembly. Students would act as representatives from the various nations and present the economic and political viewpoints in regards to problems of international peace and commerce of their respective nations.

"The students of the United States do not take as active an interest in matters of leadership in international affairs as do those of other countries" Eichelberger said "By the organization of the student conference our students are given an opportunity to develor leadership and to expres themselves on matters of work interest."
