HUSKERS PILE UP 58-26 VICTORY IN SATURDAY MEET

Masterson Leads Nebraska Splashers in Win Over Grinnell.

Capturing all but two events, the Cornhusker mermen, led by big Bernie Masterson, left a fine team of Grinnell splashers in their wake as they sped to a decisive victory of 58 to 26.

Bernie Masterson twice catapulted himself from the pool ledge to establish his supremacy in the 30 and 100 yard freestyle events by plunging to a record breaking climax. Bernie hung up a new pool record of 24.8 for the 50-yard swim and one of 58.4 for the 100 yard sprint.

Springing to a fast start the Cornhusker 400 yard relay team of Rimmerman, Easterday, Schroeder and Masterson, outclassed the representative four of Grinnell, Whitmore, Peterson, Strawn and Melborough.

Bob Gibbons, followed closely by Taggart of Grinnell and Galitzki of Nebraska, showed his heels to his opponents in the 200 yard breast stroke.

Melborough of Grinnell, who led the pace and breastst the tape to capture Grinnell's only first position, swam a pretty event when he shattered the pool record for the 150 yard back stroke with the time of 1:51.8. He was followed by his teammate Rudy, and Kuklin of the Scarlet and Cream.

Bernie Masterson, followed by Rimmerman and Peterson, carried off the laurels in the 50 yard free style and also led Strawn and Lynde to the tape in the 100 yard free.

Dan Easterday, Varsity letterman, beat Schroeder and Peterson in the 440 yard free style which he won after a longly contested battle.

Dr. Walton worked on the same project last year at Iowa university, and results were so favorable that he will continue now at his own school. The experiments will be carried on with University students and public school children.
