was convicted Wednesday of murdering her daughter-in-law, Rheta Wynkoop, and was sentenced to twenty-five years in the Illinois penitentiary. Last Nov. 21 the young victim of murder was found dead on the operating table in the west side mansion of the Wynkoop family, and after a few days Dr. Wynkoop was arrested and charged with the crime.

According to a statement made by a high official in London, a tacit agreement between non-governmental agencies, with the consent of the governments, has been reached for steadying the dollar and the pound. Although secrecy has been maintained regarding details, it is alleged that Jacob Viner, Chicago economist, who recently was in London, was instrumental in concluding the agreement.
