source method of teaching history. The aim of this method is to give the student an unbiased view of the subject.  
His attention was also turned to

philosophy, to which his friends attribute his philosophical treatment of history. Dr. Fling was strong in his opinions and was especially fervent in his support of the League of Nations and the world court.

Chancellor Burnett, when informed of Dr. Fling's death, said in part: "The death of Dr. Fling is a great regret to the university." Dr. Taylor stated: "Professor Fling had a great career which impressed the whole community." Tribute to Dr. Fling was paid in a resolution issued jointly by J. C. Mitchell and Charles A. Bowers, president and secretary of the Nebraska State Teachers association.

Professor Fling was a member of the American Historical association and La Societe de la Revolution Francaise. He founded the Nebraska Historical Teachers association in 1907 and was one of the 100 elected to the Hall of Fame.

The complete list of rules as issued by the Dean of Women's office is:

1. The residence of men and women in the same lodging house is not approved and is not permitted unless the circumstances are unusual. In this case permission must be granted by the dean of women.

2. A lady, housing women students, is expected to provide for their use until 11 o'clock, Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evening and until 12 o'clock Friday and Saturday evening, a reception room on the first floor, properly lighted. All rules referring to the reception room apply to the piazza.

3. The doors shall be locked not later than 11 o'clock, except Friday and Saturday evening, when the doors shall be locked not later than 12 o'clock.

4. All girls shall have their rooms in order by 1 o'clock, inspection by 1 p. m.

5. All girls shall report to the

house-mother where they are going and register in the sign-out book according to rules.


6. Each house shall elect a house-mother and act as a penalizing board.

7. The house committee and house-mother are empowered to inflict penalties for violation of these rules. When necessary they may report to the office of the dean of women.

8. There shall be no smoking on the premises.
