SORORITY RUSH WEEK EARLIER FOR FIRST TIME. Rush week dates for sororities have been placed ahead of freshman registration for the first time on the Nebraska campus. According to Miss Kate Fleida, chairman of the Panhellenic Board, this innovation was adopted so that scholastic and social duties of incoming girls should not be in conflict. Following a Panhellenic conference held in Chicago last spring, Nebraska is employing an idea long used in eastern scholastic centers. Each rushee was asked to pay a fee of one dollar at the beginning of formal rush week. The purpose of this fund is to aid in stabilizing rushing, so that the girls who go through rush week are those who are truly interested in affiliating themselves with some group, and are not going simply for entertainment. The money thus received will be used to cover the ordinary expenses of the Panhellenic board, thereby relieving the board from the necessity of asking appropriations from each sorority.

COBS SEEK CONTROL OF STUDENT RALLIES. Whether control of student rallies shall remain with the Innocents society or be shifted to the Corn Cobs will be decided at a special meeting of the student council called for next Wednesday by Jack Fischer, president of the council. Rallies have been under the supervision of the Innocents for several years, but the Corn Cobs are now bidding for the job. This will be the first meeting of the new student council at which official business can be transacted. Action last year was denied the new body in a May ruling which held that new members' term of office did not begin until the opening of the fall semester.
