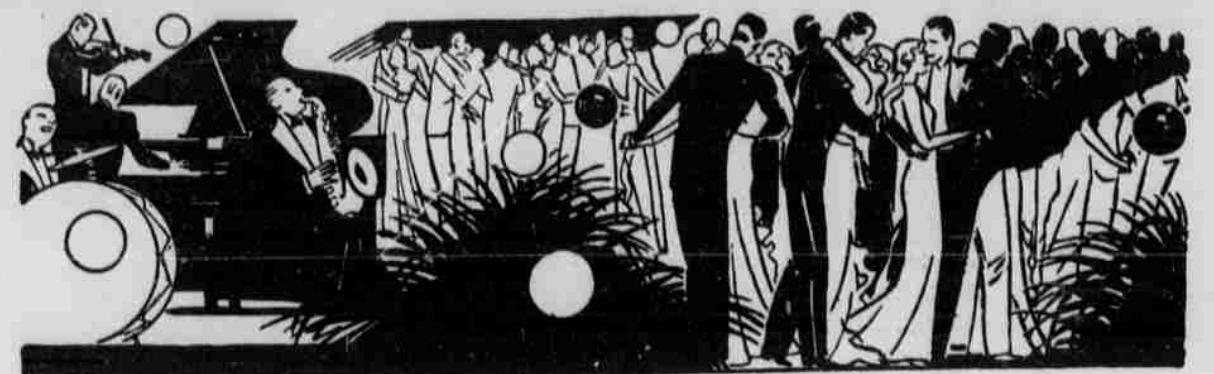
Johns Takes Geology Job.
