The Husker scoring punch will be augmented for Saturday's fray with the eligibility of Bob Leacock, Shenandoah, Ia., forward. Leacock has just rounded the rule which necessitates a year of frosh competition before varsity, and Coach Browne has determined to use him against Denver's invading basketballers.

There are also high hopes that Les McDonald, sophomore center, will have cleared the scholastic barriers which have held him off the team and will be ready for duty Saturday.

After the Denver fray, Nebraska will enter on a schedule calling for a straight round of conference games only.
