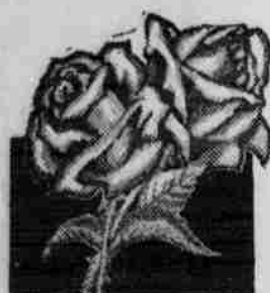

HUSKERS TANGLE WITH SOONERS IN LONE DUAL MEET

Jacobs' Speed Artists to Meet Schultemans at Four Friday.

Henry Schulte's Husker track battalion will deploy into line Friday afternoon on the Memorial stadium cinders, throwing its full fighting force against John Jacobs' Oklahoma spikesters in the first and only dual appearance before Nebraska fans. Four o'clock is the hour set for the starting event, but a rapid fire time schedule will complete the competition in little more than an hour.

Oklahoma will bring a full squad to Lincoln, but versatility seems to be more abundant in the Sooner camp, for the number of Oklahoma entrants in each event far outstrips the Scarlet representation, thus giving them an advantage in point-gaining possibilities. The hurdles, distance races, and sprints are cast as the features of the meet. Harold Jacobsen, Trenton, Mo., and Cox of Oklahoma headline the list with the battle looming between them in the century and 220-yard dashes. "Speed" registered a new meet time of 9.8 seconds in the 100-yard dash at Manhattan last Saturday, and brought home the furlong in 22.4. An injured leg muscle has troubled him this week, but is improving under Trainer "Doc" McLean's supervision.

Oklahoma's Lorris Moody and Dick Chaney ran a dead heat in the half mile last Monday in a

meet between Oklahoma and the Oklahoma Aggies, pushing the meet record back to 1:56.9. Floyd Lochner, another Sooner middle distance ace, chalked the mile run down to 4 minutes 19.8 seconds. The onslaught of the men from the south in the distance events will be met by Glenn Funk, Central City, who finished in front of Lochner in the indoor mile last, and Chet Beaver and Lester Pankonin in the half.

Burke, Sooner pride in the hurdles, set another record in the high sticks in the Oklahoma-Aggie meet, turning in a time of 14.8 seconds. The trio of Leon and Linus Carroll and Stanley Haight will hold the Nebraska strings for places in the highs, and Haight, Linus Carroll, and Kenneth Chapman will do the skipping in the lows.

"It is unfortunate that this mix-up concerning eligibility rules has occurred," Fischer said. "As the rules now stand, no exceptions whatsoever can be made, and candidates can save themselves considerable embarrassment and trouble by checking on their eligibility before filing.

Offices for which filings will be received until 5 o'clock today include 25 student council positions and 3 publication board posts. Filings are to be made at the student activities office in the coliseum in person.

While no specific rules were listed regarding eligibility of candidates for publication board positions, it was understood that adherence to the 12-27 rule would be sufficient.

everyone carry a petition around with him constantly and keep trying to stimulate interest around the campus.

"We have a good sendoff in this project," Fischer declared. "Application for a student union building will be the first application ever turned into the PWA board by the university. We have the sanction of the administration and we are rapidly obtaining complete enrollment of student support. We are going down the home stretch, and whether or not we obtain our ends dates solely in the hands of the student body."

Charles Bursik, a member of the original union building committee, stated, "The student union building is closer to this campus than it has ever been before. The architects are now going over final plans for the construction, and complete student support is the only remaining impetus necessary to a realization of the project."

In the tabulation of the petitions turned in up to date, Corinne Callin's team is leading in the number of signatures obtained with 244 to its credit. Bursik's team is second, and Don Shurtliff's group is third. About 300 petitions are still out, however, it was stated.
