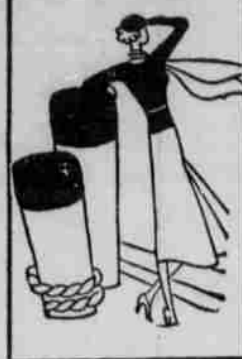


**CAMPUSOCIETY**
