Azzi Ratem System Gives Huskers 11th Among U. S. Elevens

Whether Nebraska goes to the Sugar Bowl or whether she doesn't the Huskers are still very far removed from the cellar of the American football structure.

An Azzi Ratem recording coming out of Chicago Tuesday placed the Cornhuskers eleventh among the teams of the nation. The quotations, based on the respective records of the teams thru Nov. 30, are as follows: Minnesota, 170; S. M. U., 165; Princeton, 160; Ohio State, 159; Louisiana State, 157; Notre Dame, 152; California, 151; Texas Christian, 149; Pittsburgh, 147; Stanford, 144; Nebraska, 143; Auburn, 142.

With the same report came the selection of two Nebraska athletes on Lawrence Perry's All-American and second team. The nation-wide sports critic placed Lloyd Cardwell, high point man in the Big Six this season, at right half, and Bernie Scherer, All Big Six selection for two years, at left end on his second string.

Acacia Loses by 1-0 Score on Carpenter's Goal in Final Minutes.

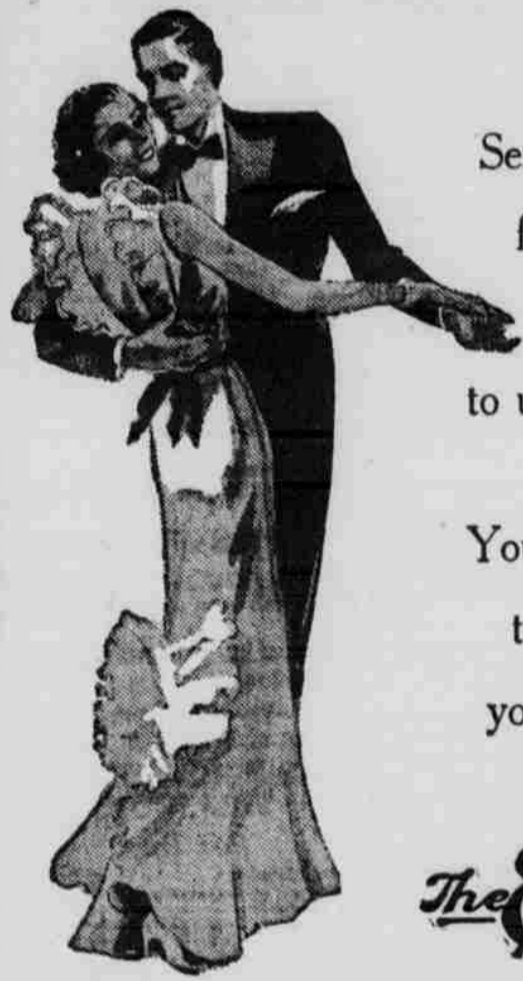

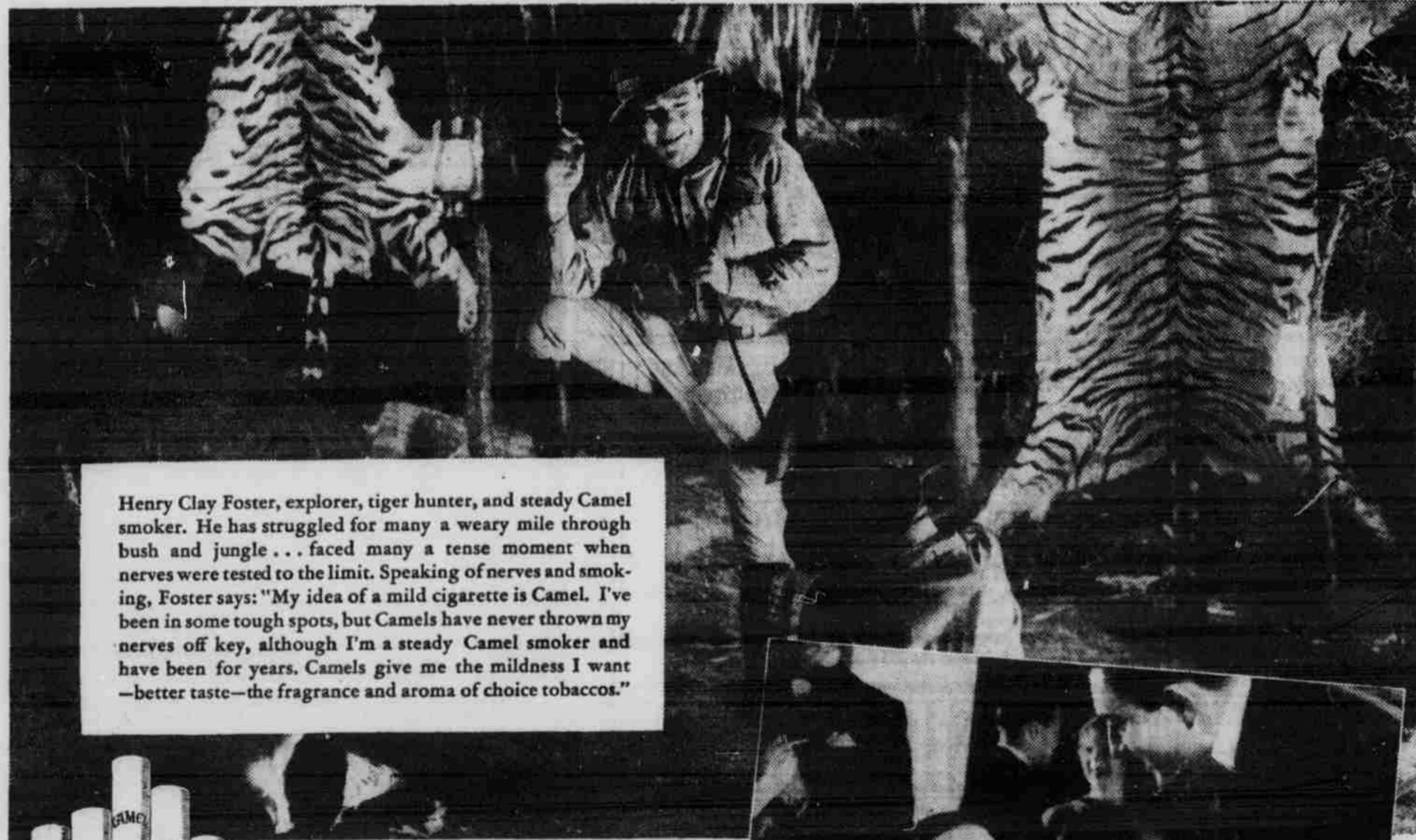
