TEACHERS TO SEE DRAWING EXHIBITS

30 Architectural Prints On Display for High School Visitors.

Thirty architectural drawings, among which are the two prize pieces of last year, will be on exhibit for the teachers of the state convention in the rooms of the architecture department Thursday, Friday and Saturday. The works will include the plan, section, elevation and plot plan of the buildings colored appropriately to the type of structure. The two first ranking pieces of last year, a plan for a mausoleum by Paul Rader, junior in the engineering college, and a plan for a suburban fire and police station, the work of Ben Mariska, will be placed in the permanent collection of the architectural library following the exhibition.


