DRUGGISTS CONVENE FOR ANNUAL SESSION IN LINCOLN MONDAY

Pharmacists Hold First Meeting With Students In Attendance.

The Nebraska Pharmaceutical Association opened its annual convention at the Cornhusker hotel yesterday, with a session devoted principally to drug clerks and students. There were over a hundred on hand at the opening of the convention.

Sulley Speaks. The address of the day was given by G. W. Sulley of the National Cash Register Company at Dayton, Ohio. He spoke on "The Principles of Salesmanship." Several short addresses and a round-table discussion completed the formal activities of the day.

There were about 40 students from the university pharmacy college and a like number from the Creighton pharmacy college at the convention. There were few of the regular members at the opening day, which was given over to the clerks. The convention proper was scheduled to get under way Tuesday morning.

Hold Joint Meeting. A joint meeting of the Nebraska Pharmaceutical Association, the Ladies Auxiliary, and the Allied Drug Travelers is to start this morning at 10 o'clock. leave Wednesday morning for Washington for the meeting of the American Council on Education. Thursday will be the closing day of the convention, coming to an end officially at noon.

ARCHITECT STUDENTS STUDY KANSAS CITY ON INSPECTION TRIP

Eight Upperclassmen Visit Outstanding Structures During 3-Day Tour.

Eight upperclass students in the department of architecture, accompanied by A. L. Pugsley, instructor in the department, made their annual inspection trip recently, investigating the outstanding structures in Kansas City, Mo.

During the three-day trip, highlights seen by the students included the Sheffield Steel works, the J. C. Nichols real estate company's new Country Club district, which included an \$85,000 home, and the Kansas City Electric Light and Power company tower.

At the Jennens Plaster works they were shown how perfect replicas of marble pillars, in plaster, were made for the Kansas City War Memorial.

K. C. Light Building. One of the most interesting displays was in the K. C. Light building, where examples of every old and modern lighting device was on exhibit. The resplendent William Rockhill Nelson Art Gallery was another high point in the trip.

At the Kansas City airport the inspectors viewed a new type of construction in airports, where provision is made for 12 different winds in the construction of the runways. Kansas City also provided the students with the latest in jail and court house construction, with a "scientific" non escape system of handling criminals. On the return journey a brief stop was made at Leavenworth, Kan.
