## Orfield to attend law convention

### NU professor will talk on 3-mile coast limit

Prof. Lester B. Orfield of the law college has been appointed riflemen to the Pershing Rifle by Dean H. H. Foster to represent the college at the annual meeting of the American Law Institute at Washington, D. C., May 11-13.

Professor Orfield, as chairman of the American Bar association subcommittee on international and comparative law, will present a report on the right of the United States to extend the three-mile

limit around its coasts.
While in Washington, Professor Orfield will also attend meetings of the American Judicature society and the convention of the National Conference of Judicial Councils. The latter association is publishing Orfield's book, "Criminal Appeal in the United States."
