

Nebraska's wrestling team takes its longest road trip of the season as the Huskers leave Wednesday for a five-day eastern trip on which they will meet Michigan

State at East Lansing Thursday, Chicago U. at Chicago Friday and Illinois at Urbana Sat-

urday. The Illinois team is the only squad of the three which faced the Huskers last year. The Illini won a meet here, 23-6, and later finished fourth in the national colle-

giates. George Seemann, erstwhile gridiron star, who has been rounding into shape rapidly, will be the Huskers' heavyweight representative and will captain the Huskers against Michigan State.
