Rain halted the first game after two innings with the Huskers out in front by 2-1, but after a thirty minute wait, the ball game was resumed.

Sid Held went all the way for Nebraska in the opener, giving but five hits, while four errors and his issuing of seven free passes to first spelled his downfall.

Bob Searle was the batting hero in the first game, slapping out a homer and batting in three scores.
