## Rose Bowl call takes Nebraska

#### Drill in Arizona

The plan for drills, when they start, is to practice here in Lincoln until Christmas vacation begins and then the encampment will move to a southwestern state, probably Arizona, to resume grid drills.

The final selection for an eastern representative to the Pasadena affair was narrowed down to just two teams by last Saturday night, Texas A. & M. and Nebraska. Boston College and Tenessee had signed to meet in the Sugar bowl at New Orleans, La., on the first day of 1941.

Texas Aggies were slated for the Rose bowl by the middle of last week but an upset victory by Coach Dana Bible and his Texas U. Longhorns threw a wrench in the Aggies grid machinery.

#### Husker alums aid

This upset brought Nebraska into prominence and Pacific coast pressure from alumni of Nebraska and neighboring states residing in California helped to bring about the final selection of Nebraska to represent the east.

While the Biffer was seeking approval from the Big Six officials, Sunday afternoon, Stanford was attempting to contact Coach Jones for final acceptance,
