Naval Reserve Flight board to interview students here

Traveling Flight Selection board for the Fairfax U. S. Naval Reserve field will be in Lincoln to examine university students interested in flight training between 9:30 p. m. tomorrow night and 8 a. m. Saturday morning.

High mathematical requirements have been entirely eliminated, according to the Naval Recruiting Station. Men students

who have 50 percent of the credits required for a degree at the university are eligible for examination and appointment.

The training for the Naval Reserve midshipman has been discontinued temporarily but may start again in early summer.
