Of the 607 students whose names appeared on the program, 374 were men and 233 women. Therefore according to these facts 60 percent of the honor students were men.

However, it must be considered that there are 4,218 men registered in the university and 2,262 women. Using these figures, 8.9 percent of the men were honored and 10.3 percent of the women.

It was also erroneously stated that Prof. L. B. Smith, chairman of the convocation committee, announced these figures which appeared in yesterday's DAILY.
