

UN regents approve sweeping faculty changes during summer

Sweeping faculty changes, embracing 130 teaching and administrative appointments, 30 resignations, six leaves of absence and the reshuffling of top rank positions in five university departments, were approved this summer by the university board of regents.

Harold Hamil was named director of the school of journalism to replace Gayle C. Walker; Robert M. Goss will serve as dean of the graduate college replacing Dr. C. S. Hamilton; C. Bertrand Schultz will serve as director of the museum; John D. Clark will replace J. E. LeRossignol as dean of the college of business administration; and K. O. Broady replaces C. E. Reed as director of the extension division.

Harris replaces Van Royen
Dr. Chauncy D. Harris was appointed assistant professor of geography in place of Professor Van Royen. Dr. Harris received his B. A. degree in 1933 from Brigham Young university and his Ph.D. degree in 1940 from the University of Chicago. In 1936 he received a B.A. degree with honors in geography from Oxford university in England. He holds also a certificate from the London School of Economics. Since 1939 he has been an instructor in geography at the University of Indiana and has also taught at the Kent, Ohio, State university.

Miss Jessie Amos was named assistant professor of home economics in institution administration and director of the College of Agriculture cafeteria in place of Miss Ruth M. Lushy. Miss Amos received a B.Sc. degree from Michigan State Teachers college in 1926 and an M.Sc. degree in 1936 from the University of Wisconsin. She was instructor in institution administration and head dietitian of residence halls at Ohio Wesleyan university last year.

Zimmerman succeeds Alway
Miss Dorothy Zimmerman was appointed assistant professor of physical education for women to succeed Miss Leonore Alway, resigned. Miss Zimmerman received a B.Sc. degree from the University of Nebraska in 1931 and an M.A. degree from Columbia university in 1937. Since 1931 she has been a teacher of physical education in the Omaha public schools.

Paul L. Bogen was approved as instructor in speech and dramatic art in place of Armand Hunter, who is on leave of absence. Bogen received his B.A. degree from the University of Nebraska in 1937 and his M. A. degree in 1940 from the University of Iowa.

J. Richard Sorby was named instructor of art education. He received his B.A. degree in 1937 from Colorado State College of Education and has been an art instructor in the Greeley, Colorado, high school since that time. He also has studied at the University

of Minnesota and the Chicago Art Institute.
