

Tigers Wait for Huskers

Big Crowd in Prospect at Mizzou

Nation's Scribes Picking Host Team by Narrow Margin Over Nebraska

Columbia, Mo., Oct. 24.—Missouri U officials hailed out the "sold out" signs here today after 29,000 reserved seats had been sold for Saturday's Tiger-Cornhusker classic.

Topping any previous attendance for a single game, the crucial Big Six engagement will fill the stands to capacity. Additional bleachers, which were erected to accommodate high school fans, assured replacement of the previous attendance record of 26,563.

Rain Haunts Tigers.

Old Jupiter Pluvius, mythical rain god who has haunted the Tiger workouts this week, again cast his spell over the Tiger workout yesterday. Forced inside by showers, the Bengals concentrated on mock scrimmage with pass defense the leading concern.

Maurice "Red" Wade, Vernon Bowen, and Leo Milla, second team backfield men, were still unable to engage in heavy drill. However, Coach Don Faurot insisted that the three sub backfielders would be available Saturday.

Top sports writers over the country were speculating today on the possible outcome of the crucial tilt. Jack Cuddy, top notch United Press scribe, gave Missouri the edge because the Bengals "have more scoring punch." Harry Ferguson, United Press sports editor, selected Missouri, commenting "Aren't there any easy ones anywhere this week?"

Bob Steuber, driving Bengal wingback, is leading the Big Six scoring derby with 27 points. Eckern, Wade, and Ice, other Missourians, rank third and fourth (tie), respectively, with 20 and 18 tallies.

With the Big Six title more than likely at stake and with five of the conference teams in action, football will take on added importance tomorrow... Kansas State is laying out in anticipation of the Husker game a week hence.

In the feature role will be the Huskers and Tigers... This is the game that everyone predicts will produce the conference champs but there are several angles to look into before a probable winner can be picked. There are many things that will come into this tilt.

In the last five years the Huskers have held a victory edge over the Tigers and the Missourians are burning for revenge... Last year with Pitching Paul Christman in his last year, Mizzou planned to drop Nebraska but got their hopes dashed to the ground by the Husker's ground force, 20-7... After the defeat Coach Don Faurot commented, "That is the strongest Nebraska team that I have seen since I came to Missouri."

Add to the fact that the Tigers are pointing with all their burning power to the fact that they have plenty of material well under control and it looks like a nigh-unbeatable combination... In Bob Steuber and Harry Ice they have two of the finest backs in the conference and when these two get started off the T formation they are nigh unstopable (if we may coin a word)... These two have a reputation for long runs, take for example several runs over 60 yards in length against Iowa State but as sort of a prediction, we don't think that there will be many long runs Saturday, not with George Abel and Al Zikmund in there.

With the Huskers employing the T to some extent and the same being true of Mizzou, it looks like one of two things... Either the final score will be high and close or it will be very low and close but there will be no in-between scores... The team on top in our book will be the Huskers—call it blind confidence if you will... But we've seen Nebraska at work this week.

Gone was the joshing, the smirking, the good-natured bantering... Gone was the overconfidence and the betting on how many touches would be scored against the Hoosiers... Instead of all these, there was concentrated effort with the backs hitting harder and the line battling consistently... It is this combination that will take the Huskers to victory down at Columbia tomorrow... We hope.

Batting around into other Big Six camps we find another football game on tap that should be interesting to watch... Kansas U. and Iowa State will mix it up to determine who will head the conference second division... Iowa State on the basis of the showings against Nebraska and Missouri will be favored in a close tilt.

Oklahoma takes on Santa Clara and all indications are that the Sooners will have a tough time in this one... In the game of the week, Minnesota takes on Michigan for first place in National ratings... The Gophers will be favored a slight bit but we go on record as saying that Michigan has a very easy chance to upset the dope.

As we see it, Minnesota has been coasting through the season merely on pre-season publicity and in my book, the Gophers haven't turned in any too-impressive victory... Michigan led by Tom Kuzma have gone up to the top the hard way with their defeat of Northwestern, Saturday, the hardest...
