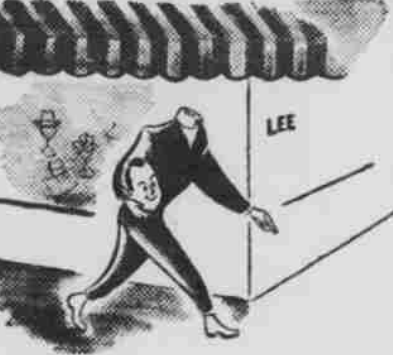
## Frosh Divide-Up for First Game Between Squads
