# War Retards Students' Plans for Married Life

By Student Opinion Surveys.

AUSTIN, Tex .- College youth, on the threshold of active participation in adult life, is having to postpone its plans for marriage.

How war is taking precedence over the every-day pursuits of most Americans is being seen everywhere every day, and how it is affecting the nation's young people is perhaps the most significant of social upheavals.

Opinions Change.

opinion surveys of America indicates that while a year ago this month at least half of the students attending colleges and universities hoped to be married within two years after leaving school, today only one-third of them have the same expectations.

Interviewing students of all ages and incomes in a proportional cross section, the surveys placed this question before hundreds of

Co-eds, it may be noted, are eager to marry sooner than men, but the hopes of all have diminished. Last year, for example, 22 percent more wanted to settle down within a year after graduation; now only 14 percent of both sexes have that hope.
