(Continued from Page 1.) parents' attention to the fact that they, the parents, are supposed to register students who are under the age limit.

If a student cannot notify his parents within the remaining time, it would be best for him to apply for his own ration book. In case a student is registered both at home and here at school, one of the ration books can be returned to the rationing board in the city or town where he resides.

Students under 18 years of age who are part of no family unit or are self-supporting should register for themselves, as should married students who are under the age limit.
