

Next Monday Night . . . Dr. Gordon Laing Speaks Before Chicago U Alums . . . On UN Campus

Dr. Gordon Jennings Laing, Alumni Dean of the University of Chicago, will address the Univer-

sity of Chicago alumni, their families and friends, at 8:00 P. M. on Monday, November 9. The meeting is to be held in Parlors X and Y of the Student Union building. Dean Laing will speak on the subject: "Old Times and New at the University of Chicago." Following the formal talk there will be an open forum, during which the dean will answer questions from the audience. About one hundred are expected to attend.

An Outstanding Scholar.
Dr. Laing, long one of the University of Chicago's outstanding scholars, was formerly dean of the division of humanities and general editor of the University of Chicago Press. He has attained fame also as an able and witty speaker.

In addition to his work as editor of the University Press, Dr. Laing has held numerous academic offices including: managing-editor of the Classical Journal, vice president of the Archeological Institute of America, and president of the American Philological Association.

The University of Toronto, the University of Western Ontario, and the University of Pittsburgh have awarded him honorary degrees.

Lincoln Artist's Guild Sponsors Annual Fall Art Exhibit in Morrill

The annual fall exhibit sponsored by the Lincoln Artist's Guild opened Monday in Gallery A of Morrill hall. The exhibit features Nebraska artists, and will continue until Nov. 22.

The Lincoln Artist's Guild is an old and respected organization. Last year it opened its membership to include a new junior division composed of students in high school and in the university.

John Kirsch Exhibits.
One complete wall of the exhibit at Morrill is devoted to the work by members of this new junior division. Two walls are displaying water colors; the remaining wall, oil paintings. There are also two showcases filled with handicrafts.

On display are two portrait studies of women by John Kirsch, son of Dwight Kirsch, artist and head of the art department of the university. John is a sophomore at Lincoln high school. His oil portrait of "Lonely Women" has caught the desolate, yearning ex-

pression on the faces of two lonely women.

Portray Cities.
Cecil Strawn, a student at the university, has two exceptional water colors of "Lincoln" and "Los Angeles." The latter is a Gonache—opaque water colors—and pictures a girl standing on a dark street corner across from a dimly-lit park—with her scarlet coat over her arm, in a relaxed, "patiently waiting" position.

A horse's head in batik, with wax and dye, has been painted by Alice Pierce, another student at Lincoln high. She also made the frame for her picture out of bamboo.

Boogie Woogie Model . . .
Bob Wilson, another university scholar, has formed a very unusual head of terra cotta which he has called "Boogie-Woogie." This should prove of interest to all "hep-cats." The head was fired once to provide orange-red hair, and then glazed a second time to make the face and neck a shiny black.

Sharon Nuss, another talented high school student, has contributed several exceptionally good soap carvings.

Marionettes Are Feature.
"The Nightclubbers," a hard-faced redhead, dressed in filmy white and silver sequins, and a droll clown attired in a scarlet satin dress coat, are the newest marionettes contributed by Marjorie Shanafelt, a member of the senior division, and an assistant at Morrill hall.

Louise Mundy, retired water color instructor at the university, has an appealing water color of two smiling rag dolls on display. The orange red hair of the little rag dolls is contrasted by the dainty blue of their suits, and the moss green of the background.
