Gift To Library . . . Christian Science Founder Wills Volume to University . . . Finest Materials

A volume of "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," the Christian Science textbook, has been given to the university by the trustees under the will of Mary Maker Eddy, author of the book and former president of the Massachusetts Metaphysical college, and former pastor of the First Church of Christ Scientist, Boston, Massachusetts.

The volume is valued at \$100. The outstanding beauty of design, quality of materials, and excellent workmanship account for this exceptionally high value of the book.

Orcutt Will Design.

William Dana Orcutt, internationally recognized among the leading designers of books, was chosen by the trustees to plan and supervise the manufacture of the edition.

The printing was done at the Plimpton Press in Norward, Massachusetts. It is set in a famous humanistic type, originally designed by Mr. Orcutt and revised by him for this special edition. This type is named "Laurentian" in honor of the ancient Laurentian Library in Florence, which has the most beautiful hand-written volumes of the humanistic scribes. The characteristics of the hand-lettering of these scribes has been preserved in the type.

Hand Made Paper.

The edition is printed upon the finest grade of English hand-made

paper that could be secured. It was made at the Eynsford Mills in Kent, England, which have been manufacturing paper for nearly 300 years. The paper is water-marked with the trade-mark of the Cross and Crown emblem, the design used for all authorized Christian Science publications.

The edition was bound by the Hartcourt Bindery, Boston, Massachusetts. The printing is in red and black throughout. The book is bound in the finest quality of Morocco, dyed a deep, permanent blue. The leather was secured in India. The volume is enclosed in a cloth-covered, fleece-lined, wooden box. The book is 10x14 inches in length and width and 2 1/2 inches thick. It has 724 pages.

Only 1,026 volumes of the edition were printed and requirements for producing such a volume preclude the possibility of reprinting. 1,000 of the books were offered for sale at \$100 each. The other twenty-six were presented by the trustees to the leading libraries of the world, one of which was Nebraska.

Uni Profs Discuss Status of Teaching In Professions

Problems of raising the status of teaching among the professions, as discussed the past summer at the University of Nebraska's second institute on professional relations, is the subject of an article in the current "Nebraska Educational Journal" by Cecil Winfield Scott and Walter K. Beggs of the teachers college.
