## Coach Weir Issues Call For Talent

Ed Weir, Cornhusker track and field coach, issued the initial call Wednesday for outdoor cinder aspirants.

"Experience is of no importance this year," said Weir. "Candidates can keep in shape for impending military call by taking daily track workouts. All Big Six schools are down in cinder talent this year and men who wouldn't place in other years, will have a chance this spring."
