Heads of the four working divisions are Dorothy Carnahan, solicitation; Bob Leinert, publicity; Virginia McCulla, treasurer; Margaret Beede, clerical.

The director of the AUF is chosen by and responsible to the advisory council. Each advisory council will select the succeeding group from members of the junior class. The advisory council receives its authority from the student council and shall be responsible to the student council.

There will be a faculty advisory group thus far consisting of Dr. C. M. Elliott of the business administration college, head of the group, and Dr. T. H. Gooding, of the college of agriculture.

Any amendments to the constitution of the AUF will be submitted to the student council for acceptance, upon recommendation of the advisory council. The recommendation will require a four to one majority of the advisory council.

Jayhawks Prep Cyclones Card Missouri Fray With Secrecy

LAWRENCE, Kan., Nov. 18.—Coach Henry Shenk has ordered secret practice all week at the University for his University of Kansas gridsters in preparation for the Homecoming game with the University of Missouri here Saturday. Only the traditional and ancient rivalry between the schools will be at stake when the teams meet since Oklahoma cinched the Big Six gontalon by rapping the Tigers in Columbia last week, and the Jayhawks are only one rung out of the cellar.

Questioned as to his plans for the week, aside from secret practice, the lanky Kansas mentor grinned and replied, "We'll try to brew up something for Old Miz-zou." Which may or may not mean anything.

The Kansans' blocking looked very bad Saturday as they pulled a hot one out of fire in the fourth quarter after spotting the Warrensburg Mules a brace of touchdowns. After trailing 12 to 0 at the opening of the final stanza, the Jayhawks sent their substitute fullback, Bill Mowery, across for two touchdowns, one of which was followed by Bill Chestnut's dropkick, which gave the Shenk-men a 13 to 12 win.

In the long rivalry between the Tigers and the Jayhawks, the Kansans have won 24 games to the Missourian's 20 and seven have ended in a deadlock. The men from Oread have not defeated the Tigers since 1934 although two games—those in 1935 and 1937—have ended in scoreless ties. Kansas has scored 546 points to Missouri's 442 in this historic rivalry.

It will be Homecoming for the Kansans and appropriate ceremonies have been set up for the edification of returning guests. One of the features will be a basketball game on Friday night between the K. U. varsity and a selected team from the army trainees at the University. A Homecoming queen and attendants will be selected, at the Homecoming
