

Iowans Decision Huskers For First Win of Season

went to the 32 on this try. Terrell on a reverse over left tackle was good up to the 44. Gallagher rammed center for 1 yard, which put the ball on the 45, fourth down and one to go for a first. Gallagher kicks out on the Husker 22.

Hollins drove over center for 5 on the first play for the Scarlet, but on the next play, Mohrbacher of Iowa stole the ball from Eager, as he tried tackle, and got to the 29 before being stopped. Larson tried tackle, but hit a solid wall and was stopped for no gain. On the next play, Larson tried a pass to Terrell, but the Iowan just couldn't get his hands on it. Larson tried a second pass, but this time, Salisbury broke the play up, with fourth coming Larson still was trying to connect in the air, this time to Bill Barbour in the end zone, but the ball was again knocked to the ground, by the alert Huskers.

Nebraska Fails to Gain.

Nebraska took over on their own 28, and after three unsuccessful tries at the line, Hollins punted to the 47, where Nebraska recovered a fumble, but the ball was called back with both sides offside. Hollins booted again, and Eager brought Larson down after he had returned a long one to the 26, but this play was called back too, on nullifying penalties. On the next play, Hollins managed to get off a long quick kick to the Iowa 39.

Eager stopped Larson after he picked up 4 yards around end. Gallagher tried the center on the next play, but lost the ball, and Ellyson fell on it for Nebraska. The Huskers took over, and in three tries made the first down of the game, with 9 playing minutes gone.

Larson Goes Through Center.

However, Terrell intercepted a Kenfield pass and returned it to his own 43 yard line, to begin what ended in the initial scoring drive of the game. Larson found a hole in the middle and went to the Husker 45 before being stopped. Gallagher drove to the 40 before Hill could make the tackle. Gallagher again hit the middle, this time down to the 34. Taking the ball twice more, Gallagher went over the middle down to the 6 yard line of the Scarlet. Two more plunges by the Iowa fullback put the ball on the 1 yard line, and on the next play, Stephens went on a quarter "sneak" for the tally. Barbour made the conversion, and the score stood 7 to 0, Iowa.

After the Hawkeyes kicked off to the Huskers, the Nebraska boys twice had to defend their goal, as the Iowans recovered fumbles deep in Husker territory. But, they could not stave off the Hawkeyes, and after taking a punt from the Nebraska 47, the

Hawkeyes rolled up their second marker with Terrell doing the lugging. After making a first down to the 34, the speedy Iowan took the ball from center, and loped around his own right end to elude three would-be tacklers and score. Barbour again converted, and the scoreboard read: Nebraska 0, Iowa 14.

Huskers Tally.

The Cornhuskers came roaring back, and after an exchange of intercepted passes, and a couple of tries at the line, Kenfield faded back and shot a long pass which began on the 45 to Hollins who outraced the Iowa secondary and gathered the ball in on the 20 and ran to the 1 yard line before being stopped. On the next play Kenfield took the ball from center on a quarterback sneak, and shoved himself over for the first Husker tally. Hill converted. The score: Nebraska 7, Iowa 14.

With but three and a half minutes of the first half remaining, Nebraska kicked off to the Iowans, who returned to their own 36. Gallagher hit center for five, but the play was called back for backfield in motion, and the Hawkeyes given a five yard penalty. Stephens then connected to Gallagher, on the Husker 44. Terrell made six around left end. On the next play, Hollins intercepted a long Iowa pass on his own 18, where he was stopped in his tracks. The Iowans recovered a fumble two plays later, and with but 30 seconds left, put the ball immediately into play attempting a long pass, but it and the next failed to connect as the half ended.

Second Half.

At the opening of the second half, Galter kicked off to Terrell, who ran the ball back up to the 27 before Salisbury stopped him hard. Sparkled by Gallagher, the Iowans drove to the Nebraska 30 before they could be stopped. There they received a 15 yard penalty for illegal use of hands, and Gallagher punted out on the Husker 9 yard line.

Penalized back to their own 4 for offside, "Buzz" Hollins was forced to punt from behind his own goal, and got off the kick of the day, as the punt was grounded on the Iowa 26 yard line. The Huskers got a break, when Bert Gissler intercepted a

juggled lateral intended for Terrell on the Iowa 18. Hollins sparked the play, and went driving all alone to the 5 yard line. On the next play, Hollins drove over to score, but the ball was called back on a /offside penalty. Ellyson then was tossed for another loss of 5, and Galter trying one in the flat just couldn't connect. Hollins then drove for 4 yards over center. On the next play, Galter faded back and rifled a left hand pass to Schneider on the two, and he punched the ball over the remaining distance for the score. Nebraska 13, Iowa 14.

The Iowans then took over for the remainder of the game, and with Gallagher and Terrell alternating on ripping the Husker line, drove across three more touchdowns to decision the Nebraskans for their first win of the season for the Hawkeyes, 33 to 13.

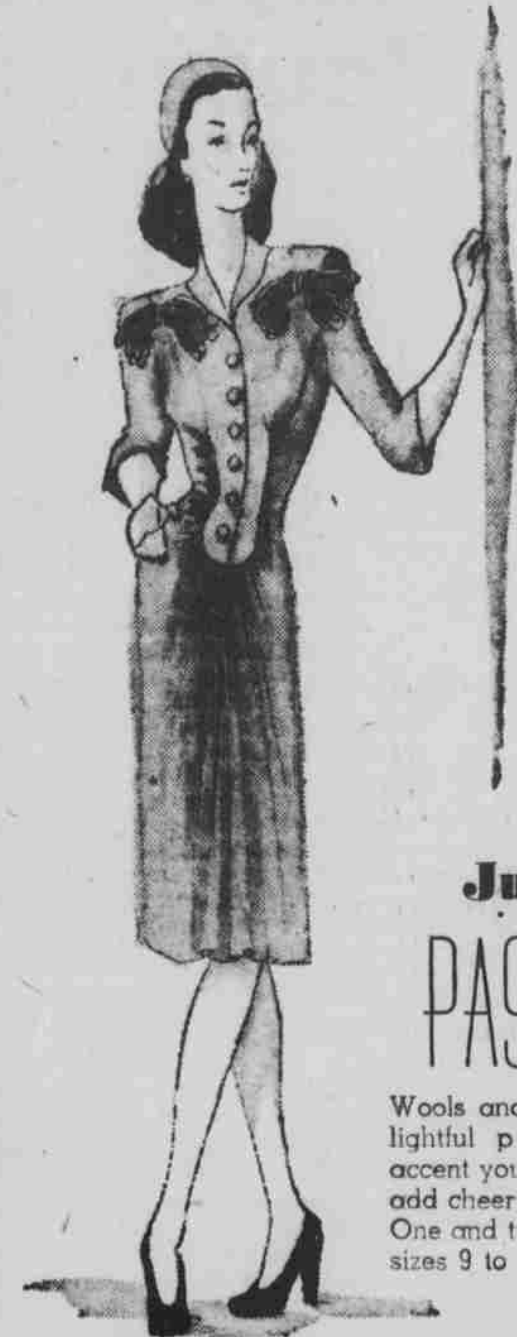
