

Oklahoma Drops Huskers, 43-32

Scarlet Falls Before Late Sooner Rally

Unable to withstand a torrid Sooner rally in the closing minutes, Nebraska's Cornhuskers dropped a 43-32 decision to trainee spiked Oklahoma at the coliseum last night.

The Huskers, down 13-19 at the half, had climbed to a 30-26 margin with nine minutes left, but here the Sooners took command.

With big Al Kirlin hitting three of his favorite one handed push shots, Nebraska had built an 11-8 lead midway in the first half, only to see quick baskets by Paine, Vaughn, and Bulow help the Sooners to their 19-13 halftime margin. The Huskers started the second half with a rush, climbing to a 23-all tie with 13 minutes left, then pulling to their 30-26 lead with nine minutes remaining on a pair of buckets by Kirlin, Tangeman's looper from the free throw circle, and Hollins' free throw.
