Competition will be ranked in four classes, A-B-C-D. Schools are classified according to size.

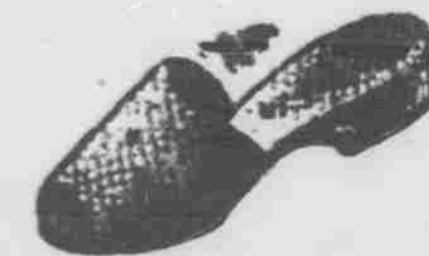

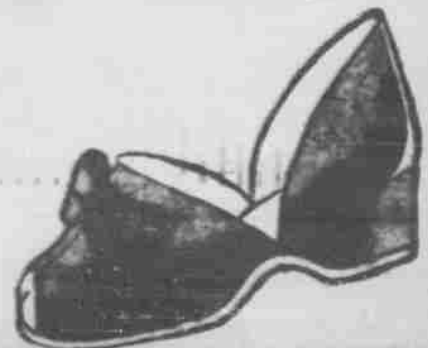
