

Local Artists Exhibit Work In UN Show

Paintings by two university faculty members and three Lincoln artists are featured at the opening exhibition of the university Art Galleries which began Sunday, Sept. 24, on the second floor of Morrill Hall.

Katherine B. Faulkner, assistant professor of drawing and painting, and Dwight Kirsch, professor of art, collaborated during the summer with Mrs. Alice Edmiston, leader in Lincoln art activities, Mrs. Barbara Ellis Ross, who works in her own studio, and John Kirsch, senior in Lincoln high school and son of Mr. and Mrs. Dwight Kirsch. The five artists worked regularly together to share facilities and to benefit by the constructive criticism of the group.

Show Best Work.

The showing in Morrill Hall is built around the best work of the five artists and privately owned pictures loaned especially for the exhibition.

Variety of subject and medium characterizes this exhibition. Fifty oil paintings are hung in Gallery A and water colors are exhibited in the second floor corrido and in Gallery B. Pastels, brush drawings and portrait studies are included in this section.

This exhibition will remain in Morrill Hall until Oct. 13. Following the first exhibit will be a show sponsored by the Lincoln Artists' Guild, in which any Nebraska artist may enter. Also included on the exhibition calendar are the All-Nebraska showing of pictorial photographs sponsored by the Lincoln Camera club, and a one-man show of the work of Howard Church, head of the art department of Washburn Municipal university at Topeka, Kas. As the climax of the showings, the 55th annual exhibition of the Nebraska Art association will be held March 4 to April 5, 1945.

Camera Fans Exhibit.

Several loan exhibits of photographs will be on view during the year, representing the work of camera clubs which exchange shows with the Lincoln Camera club. The first of these is done by the "Circle of Confusion," a group in Whittier, Calif. This group of photographs is now shown on the second floor of Morrill Hall.

An arrangement of 32 of the finest pictures of the permanent collection of the university can also be seen in Morrill Hall. The late Marsden Hartley's canvas "Mount Katahdin, Autumn," has been sent to the Museum of Modern Art in New York, where it will be shown at a select memorial exhibit honoring Hartley in October.

Gallery hours at Morrill Hall are 2:00-5:00 p. m. on Sundays, 8:00 a. m. to 5:30 p. m. on weekdays including Saturdays, and 7:00-9:30 p. m. on Tuesday evenings.
