

New Progressive Party Presents Plan To Students

PROGRESSIVE PARTY PLATFORM

I. SELECTION OF BEST-QUALIFIED INDIVIDUALS
We advocate the selection of the best-qualified and most capable person for any office, both in the party and in any political campus position. We also advocate individual and thoughtful voting in all general campus elections.

II. A THORO AND EXTENSIVE POSTWAR PROGRAM
We believe that the administration should take every advantage of the G.I. Bill of Rights to encourage former students to return to the University of Nebraska by a thoro publicity campaign. We also believe that an extensive postwar program should be instituted to erect needed buildings, to tear down the old houses marring the campus and to beautify the campus.

III. BUILDING STATE HISTORICAL MUSEUM ON CAMPUS
We would like to see the building of the state historical museum on the campus.

IV. INCREASED APPROPRIATION FROM THE STATE GOVERNMENT
In order to maintain our position as a leading institute of higher learning, we feel that the state legislature should be encouraged to increase appropriations. We also believe that an effort should be made to adjust salaries of the faculty in accordance with standard salaries of other universities, thus keeping qualified men and women on, and drawing others to the university.

V. CLOSER CONTACT BETWEEN BODY AND THE CHANCELLOR AND THE FACULTY
We believe in closer relationships between faculty and students thru the Student Council

exercising its endowed authority.

VI. FRESHMAN AND SOPHOMORE REPRESENTATION ON STUDENT COUNCIL
We believe that all students should have a voice in student government and therefore advocate a change in the Student Council constitution allowing proportional representation of all classes, including graduate, senior, junior, sophomore and freshman.

VII. EXTENSION OF PARTY CAMPAIGN PROCEDURE
We recommend extension of the rules set forth governing campaigning of political parties by the Student Council in order to permit the adequate placing of party candidates and platform before the student body.

VIII. FAIR BALLOT COUNT
We advocate that all heads of political parties on the campus be present at the counting of the ballots by the Student Council in partisan elections.

IX. ENLIGHTENED ATTITUDE TOWARD WORLD PROBLEMS
We feel that students should have an active interest in world affairs because students as members of the educated element should recognize their responsibility in the affairs of this nation in relation to world problems.

UN Party for Democratic Government Gives Plans

PLATFORM OF PARTY.
I. WE STAND FOR DEMOCRATIC STUDENT ELECTIONS; to that end we propose:
1. Open party caucuses with all registered party members allowed to vote to select all candidates and party officials.
2. Election of all candidates on the basis of qualification for the office, without regard to affiliation or non-affiliation.
3. Open counting of ballots with representatives of all parties present.
4. Independent voting in all

elections now held on a non-partisan basis.

II. WE STAND FOR MORE STUDENT PARTICIPATION IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF STUDENT AFFAIRS; to that end we propose:
1. A council of faculty members and students to discuss and adjust student-faculty problems.
2. The clarification of the powers of the student government.
3. The institution of the honor system for examinations.

III. WE STAND FOR GREATER UNITY AMONG THE STUDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY; to that end, we propose:
1. A free transportation system between the city campus and the agricultural campus.
2. The continual attempt by the proposed faculty-student council to co-operate with the existing faculty-student council on the agricultural campus to promote greater feeling of unity between the two campuses.
3. The prevention of all faction-bosses, clique-nominations and small-group dictation of campus politics.
