### Sub-committees Report.

Sub-committee reports on committee two, punishment of war criminals, also led the discussion in that committee. The sub-committee formed to list the war crimes of Germany turned in the list for Poland, Russia and France. The decision of the sub-committee on Japan favored the trial of the emporer of Japan and an army of reoccupation in Japan. Greece requested that war crimes ccmmitted by Bulgarians on Greece be given the same consideration as the war crimes committed by lems of Germany, were adopted at other axis countries, and the motion was passed.
