The motion was made and carried that a committee propose to the Board of Regents that vacation start on noon of Saturday, March 23, and end at 8 Monday, April 1. 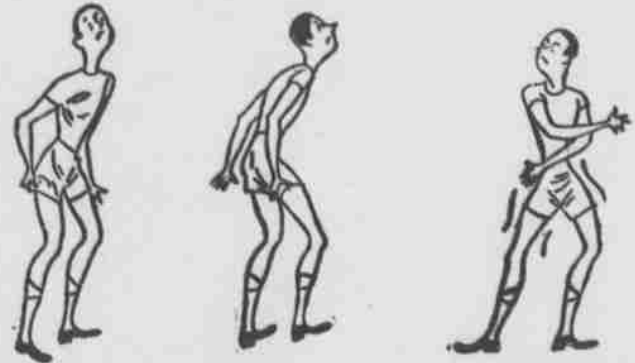

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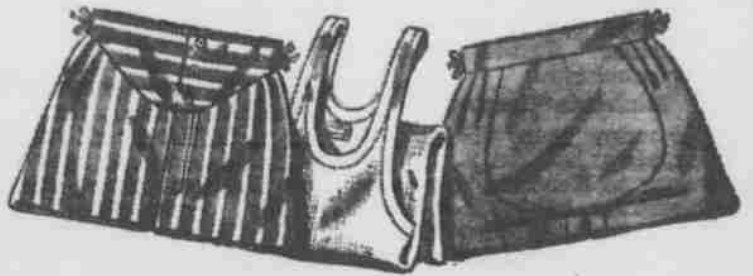
