

In individual events the Nebraska entries are paced by Herb Kansas Relays javelin Grote, champion and Dick Miller, Fairbury pole vaulter, who tied for second in the K.U. carnival. Miller could go no higher than 12 feet 6 inches last week, but vaulted a foot higher during the indoor season.

Norval Barker, who placed fourth in the 22 yard low hurdles in last years' meet, and Ralph King, Waterloo timber topper, will run in the 120 yard high hurdles. Fritz Ware, Omaha freshman, will round out the list of cinder competitors, as he is among the 100 yard dash entrants. Friday Ware will see action in the broad jump.


Field Events.


