

# Nebraska Nine Ends Season; Wins 18-2

Coach Frank Smagacz's University of Nebraska baseball team wound up its 1946 season with a one-sided 18 to 2 win over the hapless Kansas State nine Tuesday afternoon at the UN varsity diamond.

Big Jim Sandstedt hurled masterful two-hit ball for the eight innings he worked, as the Huskers marked up their ninth victory of the season against seven defeats. The win was the seventh in Big Six play for Nebraska, and gave them third place in the conference standings, behind Oklahoma and Iowa State.

### Wildcats Wild.

Every man in the Nebraska starting lineup managed to get at least one hit from the offerings of Wildcat pitcher Carl Shapley and his successor Bob Fillmore. Collectively the Scarlet batsmen pounded out 13 safeties, and were aided by 13 walks given up by the K State pitchers.

The fifth and seventh frames were the big innings for Nebraska. Five runs crossed the plate in the fifth, while in the

seventh nine Huskers tallied. Left field Truck Williams delivered the longest hit of the day when he blasted a home run to right field in the second inning.

Second baseman Fritz Hegwood, former Omaha North athlete, continued his torrid pace at the plate, as he garnered two hits Tuesday to go with his five for five performance in Monday's opener.

Bob Ives got two of the Wildcats' three hits, a single in the fourth and double in the ninth. This second blow came while Johnny Olson was on the hill for the Huskers.
