Nubbins Play Thursday Under Lights

After seeing the Nubbins team in action against the varsity third string yesterday, Coach Ray Prochaska has decided to wait until the last moment before naming his traveling squad for the game with Colorado university at Alliance tomorrow night.

During the late afternoon scrimmage, the varsity hands ran up a 50-0 count on the "B" team, indicating that the Nubbins' defense, a very apparent weakness against Iowa State, still leaves a lot to be desired.

The thirty to thirty-three players making the trip will leave Lincoln late this evening, arriving in Alliance tomorrow morning in time to be guests of the Chamber of Commerce at a luncheon honoring the team.

Over three thousand spectators from western Nebraska are expected to jam the Alliance High School stadium for the night contest, which marks the first time in many years that a Cornhusker football team has played under the arc-lights.

Immediately after the game, the squad will depart for home, reaching Lincoln early Friday morning.

UN Squad Works On Pass Defense

As expected, pass defense was the order of the day for the Nebraska Cornhuskers as they went thru a practice session Tuesday afternoon in preparation

Huskers were woefully weak against that department in Minneapolis last Saturday.

Fred Metheny, Lincoln veteran, has been named as game captain for the Saturday battle between Nebraska and Kansas State, the first conference game of the season for either squad.

Two regulars, End Jack Pesek and Tackle Vern Stiner, were absent from the starting lineup, both nursing minor injuries just bothersome enough to keep them out of the action yesterday afternoon.

The first string lined up with Jack Hazen and Alex Cochrane at ends, Mike Dibiase and Carl Samuelson at tackles, Fred Lorenz and Eddie Schwartzkopf at guards, Joe Partington at center, Sam Vacanti at quarterback, Cletus Fischer and Dick Hutton at halfbacks and Tom Novak at fullback.

On the second string were Ed Nyden and Willard Bunker at ends, Harold Becker and Bob Tegt at tackles, Gene Wilkens and Jerry Jacupke at guards, Jim Thomson at center, Dick Thompson at quarterback, Roy Long and Bill Moomey at halfbacks and Jerry Moore at fullback.

Bob Schleiger and Fritz Mandula were at the end positions for the third string, with John Sedlacek and Roger Johnson at tackles, Bob Lipps and Frannie Leik held down the guard posts, and Jack Evans was at center. Metheny, Jim Myers, Pat Rooney and Junior Collopy were the backs.

Reports from other football camps in the Big Six indicate that the Huskers were not the only team to suffer defeat as the result of faulty pass defense.

Co-sufferers along with the Cornhuskers' Bernie Masterson were Hobbs Adams of Kansas State and Mike Michalske of Iowa State, so it seems that scrub passers at all three schools will get plenty of action against the varsity in practice sessions this week.

The statistics of the Kansas State-Hardin Simmons battle present an interesting story. Hardin-Simmons, the winning team, attempted 16 passes, completed only five, yet amassed a net gain of 110 yards via the airlines.

Kansas State, on the other hand, connected on nine of 24 efforts for a gain of 93 yards. The

difference came in the fact that three of the five tosses the Texans completed went for touchdowns, while only one of the Wildcat passes was good for a score. Five K-State passes were intercepted by the winners.

Former Nebraska backfield flash Ted Kenfield of Columbus served as game captain for the University of California Bears in their opening game against Wisconsin last Saturday. Kenfield is the starting right halfback on the Berkeley eleven.

Movies of the Minnesota-Nebraska game show that Guard Freddie Lorenz of the Huskers stood out throughout the game with his sturdy defensive work.

Movies of other Nebraska

games will be shown early in the week following the games, says Ed Weir, who directs the university field camera service.

The Nebraska two-mile squad is idle this week, but Coach Weir is readying plans for an 880-yard relay between the halves of the Husker-Wildcat struggle. With a number of promising 220 and 440 men drilling each night, the Husker mentor is anxious to give them a taste of competition.

Although the Iowa State football team was beaten by Northwestern, 41-9, the consensus of opinion among coaches and newsmen indicated that the Cyclones looked better than they had against Colorado a week earlier. In the first game Colorado beat Iowa State 13 to 7.
