An ambitious program of orchestra, choral and band groups will climax three days of intensive rehearsals by the 675 high school students taking part in the Nebraska Music Educators' 11th annual clinic concert, tomorrow at 8 p. m., in the coliseum. This is the first time in 12 years that the clinic has met in Lincoln.

Robert Shaw, the gifted choral director formerly with Fred Waring, will lead the 400-voice choir in eight selections ranging from Bach to Negro spirituals, one of
