Attendance figures just released by the university athletic department reveal that the crowd last Tuesday night at the Cornhusker-Kansas university basketball game broke all previous Coliseum attendance records. The crowd of 8,819, including non-paying patrons, exceeds the old mark by almost 1,500 fans.

The last attendance mark was set at the UN-KU tussle in 1936,

when 7,378 persons were attracted by the game on which the Big Six championship rested.
