

Husker Cagers Host To Jacks '5' Tonight

The resurgent Nebraska basketball team, riding the crest of a two game victory wave, will be expected to pick up its third consecutive win and ninth of the season against the South Dakota State quintet tonight at the coliseum at 8 p. m.

Despite the loss of two regulars, the Husker team fashioned a pair of impressive triumphs in its most recent starts. Against the favored Drake outfit the Scarlet turned in a rousing 65-44 win. Rodney Cox and Bob

Cerv were the big cogs in the uprising, and were joined by Claude Retherford the following night when the Scarleters dumped the Ottumwa Navy team, 70-53.

Cerv Sparkles.

Cerv, the hustling Weston, Neb., product, has hit the scoring pace that he has needed to become a top-flight performer. Coach Harry Good has been able to get along without Guard Joe Loisel, who was lost via eligibility rulings, now that Cerv has come to life.

The other absentee is Center Don McArthur, the six-foot five-inch pivot man, who has turned in his equipment with the explanation that a knee injury has prevented him from continuing his hardwood activity.

Former Omaha North stalwart Dick Schleiger has taken over the center spot and has turned in acceptable jobs in recent NU appearances.

The other three members of the Husker starting lineup have been fixtures in starting roles since the season opened. Claude Retherford, the squad's high scorer, and Rod Cox, Lincoln point-maker, will be at the forward posts, while Jump-in Joe Brown, Nashville, Tenn., athlete, will team with Cerv in the backcourt.

Familiar Mentor.

Coach Thurlo McCrady, former coach at Hastings College, will bring a 14-man squad to Lincoln for tonight's battle. The Jackrabbits have yet to win a game away from home and in view of the Huskers' recent showings the South Dakota team will have to pull a major upset to break the jinx.

Forward Jim Schmidt, a six-foot three-inch hotshot, paces the visitors. He has been tabbed as the best player ever to come out of the Brookings, S. D., institution, and has paced the Jacks throughout the season.

Nebraska will have a sizable height advantage since Schmidt is the tallest member of the South Dakota State club. Shorty of the squad is starting Forward Harry Franz, who at five-foot six is almost a foot shorter than the Huskers' Dick Schleiger.

Final Fling.

Tonight's game will be the last non-conference tilt on the Nebraska state. Following the Jack-rabbit encounter Coach Good's charges will prepare for their third meeting with Iowa State.

Nebraska scored a narrow win over the Cyclones in the Kansas City journey, but dropped a Big Six game to the Iowa State outfit at Ames last month.

UNSwim Team To Meet Potent Cyclone Squad

Swimming Coach Hollie Lepley has announced his traveling squad for the dual meet Wednesday with Iowa State at Ames. The squad's last appearance resulted in a 48-33 win for the Huskers at the expense of the University of Colorado tankmen.

Performances of the two teams indicate that Iowa State will be highly favored, as they eked out a 43-41 decision over the same Minnesota team that trounced Nebraska, 58-27. Individual star for the Cyclones is freshman Roger Watts, a speedy 220 yard free style man, who has broken several Iowa State records.

Grimm Stars.

The only Husker mark in the Colorado meet better than the Iowa State marks was Marvin Grimm's 56.1 in the 100 yard free style event. Grimm further established himself as a star in the Colorado meet with his two victories, in the 50 and 100 yard free styles. His 50 yard mark was 24.8.

Other Nebraska winners against Colorado were Roger Moore, who won the diving competition; Les Oldfield, who finished first in the 150 yard back stroke; 200 yard breast stroker Conrad King, and Dean Porter, who took the 440 yard free style with a time of 6:01.3. Oldfield's time was 1:56, while King finished his event in 2:48.4.

The traveling squad includes Les Oldfield, Conrad King, Dick Draper, Dean Porter, Bill Burr, Marvin Grimm, Bill Case, Perry Branch, Roger Moore, Jack Campbell, Frank Kinzie, and Barton Greenberg.

Scarlet Matmen Win; Mike Upset

Nebraska's wrestling team won its third match of the season by edging the University of Minnesota matmen, 14-12, at the coliseum Monday night but the Gophers took home a moral victory when heavyweight Verne Gagne defeated the Husker ace Mike DiBiase in the final bout by a 4 to 2 decision.

The defeat was the first for Big Mike in 53 bouts and came only after a heated debate between officials and coaches. At the end of the second period Gagne had a 2 to 1 margin but DiBiase managed an escape to tie the count.

Neither grappler could score again and with 30 second remaining the score was announced as 4 to 2 in favor of the Nebraska man. However, a recheck showed that Gagne had the time advantage which was worth two points and the victory.

Early in the second period milling Mike had Gagne in precarious straits until blood flowing from

a cut on DiBiase's nose forced Referee Bill Doyle to halt the action temporarily.

Valuable Fall.

With Harold Boker sidelined by an arm infection brother Marshall took over the limelight and provided Nebraska's winning margin by throwing Bernie Lindquist in a 165-pound struggle after 4:34.
