### No Inspections,

Control desks inside the doors in each reading room are being eliminated. Students may pass freely from one room to another without submitting to inspection at each of the control desks. Under the new system, two new control desks will be established at the head of the central stairways. Attendants will inspect books and briefcases at these desks, but all books are to be checked out at the loan desk.

Books on two-hour reserve will be found as usual at the reserve desk in the northeast corner of the third floor and are to be checked out and returned at that desk

## Williams Holds 'Macbeth' Cast **Tryouts Today**

Remaining tryouts for "Macbeth" will be held in Room 201 of the Temple today from 3 to 6 p. m., and from 7 to 9 p. m., tomorrow night. All regularly enrolled students in the university who are passing in 12 hours are eligible to try out.

Dallas Williams, University Theater director, stated that any student who is seriously interested in trying out for a role in the play must plan to attend at least two of the three tryouts. The first tryouts were yesterday from 3 to 6 in the Temple.

The complete cast of characters for "Macbeth" will include 25 men and eight women, with some of the actors playing double roles. The play will be staged in Shakespearcan costume. The twenty scenes of the play will be staged with unit sets of steps and platforms with back drapes.

#### Cast.

The cast includes Duncan, King of Scotland; Malcolm and Donaldhain, his sons; Macbeth and Banquo, generals of Duncan's army; Macduff, Lennox, Ross Mentieth, and Angus, noblemen of Scotland; Fleance, son of Banquo: Seyton, servant attending Macbeth: a sergeant; a doctor; a porter; first lord; Lady Macbeth; a gentlewoman; three murderers; second lord and second lady; five soldiers; two torchbearers; two trumpeters; and three witches. The first torchbearer will double as the messenger; the second torchbearer will also play the porter. The gentlewoman takes the part of the first lady.
