Five Factors.

The economist said at least five factors will influence livestock prices in the future. They were listed as: Number of slaughter grade animals offered for sale; level of employment; government expenditures to supply our armed forces; foreign loans and competition of other products.

Miss Mary Guthrie, member of the University home eco-nomic staff, forecast that most cottons will be plentiful in the future, except combed broadcloth for shirts. She forecast a favorable outlook for rayon and said that it will continue to gain in importance at the expense of natural fibers. "Raw silk will remain a luxury item," Miss Guthrie
